

## Quiz WHAT IS YOUR DIAGNOSIS?

We present an endometrial tumor of a 55-year-old patient with a complaint of postmenopausal bleeding.

On macroscopic examination, a solitary tumoral lesion measuring  $35 \times 35$  mm, infiltrating the outer 1/2 of the myometrium, with a hemorrhagic cross-sectional surface was observed (Fig. 1).

Histologically, a high-grade tumoral lesion with epithelioid morphology was observed. The tumor consisted of large epithelioid and polygonal cells forming solid structures. Hemorrhage, nuclear atypia, frequent mitosis, and occasional anastomosing vascular structures were observed (Figs. 2, 3).



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Tumoral cells were diffuse positive for vimentin (Fig. 4A), HMW+LMW-CK (Fig. 4B), CD31 (Fig. 4C), and ERG (Fig. 4D).
